WDNA Codes Of Behaviour Parent/Guardian

Waverley District Netball Association with the support of the Netball Victoria Codes of Behaviour aim to provide a safe and welcoming competition and environment for all our participants and community.

The Parent/Guardian Code of Behaviour is in addition to the Netball Victoria's Codes of Behaviour and the Waverley District Netball Association General Code of Behaviour.

Clarification of Parent/Guardian Code of Behaviour

<u>Point 7</u> – If you disagree with an **umpire** or coach, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question their judgement and honesty in public.

At Waverley District Netball Association, the appropriate channels are:

- For teams competing in the 13 & under and 11 & under sections, parents should pass their concerns on to the team coach and the team coach may approach an umpire supervisor during the break to respectfully qualify why the decision/call was made or to seek interpretation of the rules
- For teams competing in the 15/17/19 and under and open sections, the team captain may approach the
 umpire during the break to respectfully qualify why the decision/call was made or seek interpretation of the
 rules

In addition to Netball Victoria Code of Behaviour:

- Parent/Guardians must not approach a player of another team to question their behaviour or comment (unless positively) on their game
- Parent/Guardians are not to openly criticise or chastise umpires and any decision they make during the game
- Parent/Guardians are not to openly criticise or chastise players from the other team

If there are any concerns about sportsmanship or umpiring during the game, a representative from the team may approach an umpire supervisor or WDNA committee member to come and observe the game.

Consequences for Breaches of the Parent/Guardian Code of Behaviour

If any breaches of the Codes of Behaviour are deemed to threaten WDNA's provision of a safe and welcoming competition and environment for all our participants and community, the following applies:

- 1. The offending party will be requested to leave the premises
- 2. If the offending party refuses to leave the premises, the parent will be suspended from the competition
- 3. Continual offences will result in the parent/guardian being suspended from the competition
- 4. If the behaviour does not cease, the child who the offender is responsible for will be suspended from the competition

Please note; Waverley District Netball Association reserve the right to suspend teams or Clubs if their parent/quardian members continually do not observe and behave within the Codes of Behaviour.
